Dear Donor,

This letter is for requesting your support of the 2025 E3 Camp (Empowering Excellence thru Exploration Camp). Our mission is to provide middle and high school African-American students with hands-on activities, educational field trips and opportunities, and career skills in the Arts and STEM fields, necessary to be productive citizens in the 21st century workforce.

Last July community donors provided the opportunity for 27 students to attend this FREE 3 week - Art and STEM Camp. Students were engaged in numerous activities such as building airplanes, goal wisdom boards, robots and solar cars. Field trips were taken to the Chapel Hill Public Library, 82nd Airborne Museum, Greensboro Science Center, Historic Stagville Plantation, UNC Communication Department, and UNC Exercise Department. We were able to have 26 professional experts visit the students, representing such fields as aviation, coding, fire technology, forensic science, gaming, math, plumbing and water to name just a few.

Over the last 7 years, 130 African-American students have attended E3 Camp and 43 of them have become "repeaters." Those youth have come back to the camp - ranging from 2 to all 7 years of the camp. Camp dates will be July 7th thru the 26th at the Chapel of the Cross.

E3 Camp Board of Directors hope that you will be inspired to make a donation to this worthwhile cause that gives African-American middle and high school students opportunities for the Art and STEM fields, which is greatly underrepresented by minorities.
